What we Believe

1. OUR BELIEFS ABOUT GOD

There is one unique and eternal God, who exists in an everlasting, loving relationship of Father, Son and Holy Spirit - one God in three persons - co-eternal in being, co-eternal in nature, co-equal in power and glory (Deuteronomy 6:4; 2 Corinthians 13:14). God is sovereign in all things: including creation, revelation, salvation, judgement and the establishing of His kingdom. As the sovereign loving Creator and Redeemer, He is worthy of all glory, honour and praise.

2. OUR BELIEFS ABOUT THE BIBLE

The Bible, Old Testament and New, is God's revelation to us. It is God-breathed and infallible as originally given, and has supreme authority in all matters of faith, conduct and experience (2 Timothy 3:16, 17; 2 Peter 1:20, 21; Matthew 5:18; John 16:12, 13). Scripture is sufficient for knowing God and His plan. It is not only central to the well-being of the church but is able to thoroughly equip the Christian community for life and godliness.

3. OUR BELIEFS ABOUT HUMANITY

Men and women together are created in the image of God, and therefore enjoy a unique dignity in creation and a unique relationship with God. Men and women together have dominion over the created order (Genesis 1:26-28). Tragically, human nature is universally sinful since the Fall and all are guilty before God. This leaves us under the wrath and condemnation of God (Romans 3:9-11). We are unable and unwilling to turn ourselves to God, without the prior work of God's Spirit who gives us new birth (Romans 8:5-8; John 3:3.5).

4. OUR BELIEFS ABOUT THE PERSON AND WORK OF CHRIST

The Lord Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God, who became man without ceasing to be God, having been conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary in order that He might reveal God and redeem sinful humanity (John 1:1-2, 14; Luke 1:35). The Lord Jesus Christ accomplished our redemption through His death on the cross as our representative and sub-

stitutionary sacrifice. As a result of Christ's death the guilt, penalty and controlling power of sin is removed. In addition, God demonstrates both His justice and His love to us most perfectly at the cross and establishes His victory over Satan and all His foes. Our justification and our resurrection are made sure by His bodily resurrection from the dead (Romans 3:24; 1 Peter 2:24; Ephesians 1:7; 1 Peter 1:3-5). The Lord Jesus Christ ascended into heaven and is now exalted at the right hand of God where, as our King and High Priest, He fulfils the ministry as Ruler, Representative, Intercessor, and Advocate (Acts 1:9, 10; Hebrews 7:25; Hebrews 9:24; Romans 8:34; 1 John 2:1-2). We believe Jesus is coming again to judge the living and the dead (1 Peter 4:5; Romans 14:9; 2 Timothy 4:1).

5. OUR BELIEFS ABOUT THE WORK OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

We believe that the Holy Spirit is a person who convicts the world of sin, of righteousness, and of judgement. He brings about regeneration, baptising all believers into the body of Christ, indwelling and sealing them for the day of redemption (John 16:8-11; 2 Corinthians 3:6; 1 Corinthians 12:12-14; Romans 8:9; Ephesians 5:18). His role is to bring glory to Jesus Christ thus making Jesus Christ central in all things. The Spirit works to illuminate believers' minds to grasp the truth of Scripture, producing in them His fruit, granting them His gifts and empowering them for service.

6. OUR BELIEFS ABOUT SALVATION

We believe that salvation is the gift of God given by grace and received by personal faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, whose precious blood was shed for the forgiveness of our sins (Ephesians 2:8-10; John 1:12; Ephesians 1:7; 1 Peter 1:18-19). There is only one name under heaven by which we can be brought into relationship with God: the name Jesus Christ. The work of the Holy Spirit is necessary to make the death of Jesus effective in an individual's life. The Spirit enables the sinner to repent and put their faith in Jesus Christ, so that salvation is entirely of God's grace and not of human merit or works. We choose God because He first chose us. Although we now enjoy



the blessing of union with Christ and a secure relationship with God, we await the final consummation of our hope with the return of Christ, the resurrection of our bodies, and life with Him eternally in the new heavens and the new earth.

7. OUR BELIEFS ABOUT FINAL JUDGMENT

We believe that all people (living and dead) will stand before the final judgment seat of Jesus Christ and hear His declaration of their eternal destiny based on their individual and personal response to God's offer of salvation. Such a declaration will be entirely just and fair (1 Peter 1:17, Romans 2:11, Romans 3:19, Colossians 3:25). We also believe that hell is real - that it is a place of eternal conscious punishment for those who have ignored and rejected God's offer of salvation. It is this reality of final judgment that motivates us out of loving concern to tell others about Jesus, forgive others freely, to live godly and upright lives and to have our inward



need for justice in the world to be satisfied.

8. OUR BELIEFS ABOUT THE ASSURANCE OF BELIEVERS

All the redeemed, once they are saved, are kept by God's power and are thus secure in Christ forever (John 6:37-40; 10:27-30; Romans 8:1, 38-39; 1 Corinthians 1:4-8; 1 Peter 1:5). We believe that it is the privilege of believers to rejoice in the assurance of their salvation through the testimony of God's Word, which clearly forbids the use of Christian freedom as an occasion for sin (Romans 13:13-14; Galatians 5:13; Titus 2:11-15).

9. OUR BELIEFS ABOUT MINISTRY AND SPIRITUAL GIFTS

We believe that God is sovereign in the bestowing of spiritual gifts. It is, however, the believer's responsibility to attempt to develop their sovereignly given spiritual gift(s). The baptism of the Holy Spirit occurs at conversion and involves the placing of the believer into the Body of Christ. God grants His gifts for the purpose of loving service, not self indulgence. Their use is determined not simply by personal desire for fulfilment or satisfaction, but by the principle of building the church. We also believe that no particular spiritual gift(s) proves the presence of the Holy Spirit or is an indication of deep spiritual experience (1 Corinthians 12:7, 11, 13; Ephesians 4:7-8). We believe that God does hear and answer the prayer of faith, in accordance with His own will, for the sick and afflicted (John 15:7; 1 John 5:14, 15). We believe that it is the privilege and responsibility of every believer to minister according to the gift(s) and grace of God that is given to him (Romans 12:1-8; 1 Corinthians 13; 1 Peter 4:10-11).

10. OUR BELIEFS ABOUT THE CHURCH

We believe that the visible church is the gathering of believers around Christ in His Word. It is a community of people intended by God to bear witness to Him and actively seek the extension of His rule. Within its community both men and women are to build up the church in love and truth. The church is the body and bride of Christ, made up of all born-again believers (Ephesians 1:22, 23; 5:25-27; 1 Corinthians 12:12-14; 2 Corinthians 11:2). The Bible makes clear that in church leadership, as in marriage, the roles of men and women are not interchangeable. We are committed to expressing the differences within relationships mindful of our mutual dependence. Gender is just one of many distinctions (ethnic, socio-economic etc.) that points to the ultimate and eternal unity where God's people will be fellowship with one another and glorify Him forevermore in the new creation (Revelation 7:9-10).

CONNECT

Connecting, Growing & Serving

Our Goal: Great groups and thriving Christians encourage a deepening relationship with God and relationships of Integrity with other people.

At St John's, a connection focus uplifts the importance of worship, prayer, and fellowship in our everyday lives. Connect means to be in vital relationship with God, other believers, the church, and our family. It reminds us of the priority of building positive, long-lasting relationships with people at work, in the school and community, and at home.

As we connect first with God, He makes it possible for us to build meaningful relationships with other believers; they, in turn, help us connect to a church family. These interconnected relationships enable us to welcome people who are not yet part of our church or who on a journey of faith.

St John's encourages every member to connect with God and others every day. We run a number of regular activities to help us work together on connecting to new people. These include events such as Gingerbread house making, onsite picnics, Chinese new year, movie nights and much more (See Website & Facebook page)

Connecting, Growing & Serving

Our Goal: Great groups and thriving Christians explore God's Word with other believers, participating in the life change that results from believing and obeying God.

St John's grow focus means knowing and obeying God's Word and understanding how it makes a daily difference in our lives. Gaining knowledge is vital, but we need more than information. True discipleship means discovering something fresh and inspiring in a passage we have read hundreds of times—and acting to apply it.

The St John's team focuses on clear bible teaching that focus on life transformation. We teach the bible in large gatherings (10am English, 10am Mandarin and 5pm Gatherings), in groups of around ten people (Discipleship groups) and one to one. Everyone is growing in our community, from the staff team to our preschool to our aged care gathering.

St John's desires to be a true Christ cultured church. We have some language specific events, but aim to integrate into a truly multi-ethnic gathering worshipping Jesus.

We run a number of focused teaching events that apply biblical reflection to stages of life—pre marriage, parenting, ethics and more.

St John's currently has five music teams, and acknowledges the central role of music in our growth together. We endeavour to include old favourite hymns and new popular songs introduced at conferences we regularly attend including KYCK, CMS Summer school and others.

Our Goal: Great groups and thriving Christians embrace a lifestyle of focused ministry, serving others out of their spiritual giftedness and mutual encouragement.

Serve reminds us of our responsibility to work alongside fellow believers. St John's is full of ministry and service opportunities—from cooking a meal to hosting a youth fellowship to teaching Sunday School classes. Every believer working together is required for a local church to function as God intended. God gifts and empowers us to serve and multiplies our efforts in many ways.

St John's has a proud history of local service since 1879. Our service to our church community and beyond continues in 2019 through our aged care service at New Horizons, St John's Preschool, BLAST after school children's club, Anchor Youth, Lean English ESL classes, Community advocacy in partnership with Ryde Council, Ping Pong, NRG Holiday Program, Anglicare partnership and much more.

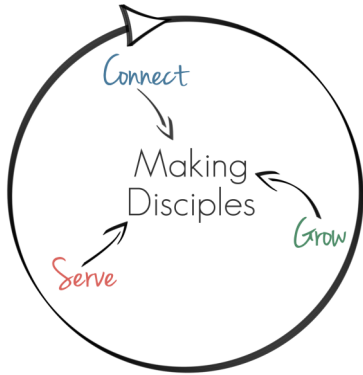




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Our Vision

Sunday Gatherings

Our Gatherings (or Services) are at:

- 10am English Service—Auditorium
- 10am Mandarin Service—Hall #2
- 5pm English Service—Auditorium

What do I need to wear?

Dress code is casual. Our spaces are fully air conditioned so you will be warm in winter and cool in summer.

What happens?

During the gathering we will sing songs of praise to our great God, hear the Bible read and explained (sermon), talk to God in prayer. Services go for 75 mins.

What about Children?

During 10am gatherings children participate with parents during the first 15 minutes with singing and a kids story, then depart for Kids Church.

(Creche, Infants, Primary and Discipleship Groups for teens).

During 5pm Junior High leaves for Discipleship groups after 15 minutes.

Can I leave at any time?

Yes... We are focused on serving all who attend, and want you to feel both comfortable and safe. You can get up and walk around during the gatherings.

What happens at the end of the gathering?

At the end of the morning services morning tea is served (tea / coffee / cappuccino / fruit / cold water). Families often have lunch together in homes or at one of the adjacent Cox's Rd Restaurants and Take Away shops.

At the conclusion of the 5pm service, a light meal is served at 6:30pm (\$3)

You can find out about all our ministries on our website—but a couple deserve a 'ministry focus' as they capture best practice as we engage in Connecting, Growing and Serving together.

The NRG (North Ryde Games) program focuses on teen leadership development. The day starts with a breakfast pre-meeting, then supervised program delivery 9-1pm, finishing with afternoon review, training and preparation.

Of course, K-5 students don't miss out! They have an awesome interactional Christian program of bible stories, song, dance, drama and craft delivered by teenagers under the supervision of adult trainers and co-ordinators.

During the week we connect with over 100 new families, we grow in the likeness of Jesus, and we Serve across all age groups, nationalities and languages.



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Another ministry which best captures Connect, Grow and Serve is our after school children's program BLAST. Blast connects to eighty families weekly, and helps both attending children, trainee teenage leaders and adult co-ordinators grow like Jesus together. The program piggy backs onto our mid year NRG program, giving children, teens and adults ongoing partnership in connecting, growing and serving.

St John's Preschool NORTH RYDE

St John's Preschool was established in 1970 by the Parish Council of St John's Anglican Church, North Ryde. St John's Preschool is a not-for-profit community based preschool and provides an educational and care program for children aged 3 to 5 year olds. St John's Preschool is funded and licensed by the Department of Education and Community Services. We are licensed for 40 children per day.

The philosophy of the preschool is founded on and shaped by Jesus and as a result we love and serve God in all that we do. Children participate in Bible stories and daily prayer and this is embedded in our daily routine. In addition to this twice a week the children and educators attend a 'mini' church service run by ministry staff from St John's. We regularly hold a preschool church service where all families are invited to attend and join in. We embody the vision of connecting, growing and serving.

All educators at St John's Preschool are qualified early childhood educators.

Baptism & Belonging

St John's celebrates God's work amongst us through Baptism and Confirmation (For those who were baptised as children). Both Baptism and confirmation courses are held regularly. Please speak to a staff member to find out more.

Our belonging course is a three week program held on Sunday afternoons where staff lead us through a reflection on the ministry of Jesus and how we live in response here at St John's.

¹⁸ Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:18-20)



Discipleship Groups

Gathering in small groups has been the pattern of church life since the early church. In Acts 2:42-47 we read of the disciples gathering for teaching and fellowship.

The goal of these groups is to develop maturity (Colossians 1:9-12). This process of teaching & fellowship leading to maturity is best captured in the word 'Discipleship' - Jesus gathered a small group of followers around him, the Disciples, and through teaching and fellowship led them into maturity.

St John's has many groups including Exploring Christianity, Christian Basics, Discipleship Groups (preparing for our sermon series), Focus Groups (Marriage, Divorce, Parenting). Our current groups run at different times and locations.

In 2019 we are introducing Women's groups on Tuesday Nights, Men's groups on Thursday nights.

They will follow this format:

6:30pm	Light meal served
7:00pm	Discipleship Groups
8:30pm	Leaders Training
9:30pm	Close

⁴² They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. ⁴³ Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. ⁴⁴ All the believers were together and had everything in common. ⁴⁵ They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. ⁴⁶ Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, ⁴⁷ praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. 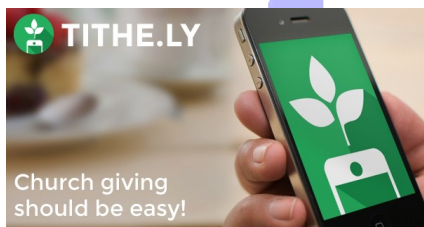

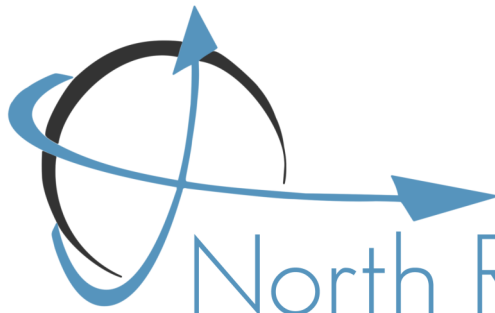
