Household Worship – First Order

The following resource is intentionally flexible in form. It may be adapted according to what your church is offering on a Sunday. Some churches provide livestreamed or prerecorded sermons; in which case, much of the following order of service would be adapted for use in homes – see especially, the singing of the Psalms. Other churches provide a full service via livestream or prerecorded video; in which case, the prayers of preparation and concluding communal prayers may help. There may be various other offerings from our churches, and therefore the structure below may be adapted accordingly. Whatever the order of service, the following structure is designed to enable participation, active worshippers who worship in fellowship together.

Starting with Scripture

Read aloud a good introductory sentence of Scripture (e.g., Isa. 55:6-7; Dan. 9:9-10; Acts 17:30-31; Titus 2:13-14; Heb. 4:14-16; 1 John 1:8-9, etc.)

Prayer of Preparation

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Or, another suitable prayer to help focus on our meeting with Almighty God.

Confession of Sins

Our Lord Jesus Christ said:

You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength. This is the first and greatest commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.

Lord, have mercy on us: and write your law in our hearts by your Holy Spirit.

Or

Almighty God, our heavenly Father we have gone our own way, not loving you as we ought, nor loving neighbour as ourselves. We have sinned against you in thought, word and deed and in what we have failed to do. We deserve your condemnation. Father, forgive us. Help us to love you and our neighbour, and to live for your honour and glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Declaration of Forgiveness

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, has promised full forgiveness to all who come to him with true repentance and faith in his Son. God forgives us because Jesus is the perfect sacrifice for our sins. **Amen.**

Or,

Read a suitable passage of Scripture which speaks of God's assurance of forgiveness (e.g., Matt. 11:28; 1 Tim. 1:15; Psalm 103:8-12; 1 John 1:8-9; Rom. 10:9-10, etc.)

Or,

Before the service, ask a member of the group to choose a passage of Scripture which speaks of God's assurance, and at this point in the service, have them share why this is a treasured passage to them.

Singing or Saying the Psalms

Here one of the Psalms may be sung (visit psalms.seedbed.com for lyrics and music) or read together (perhaps share the reading of the Psalms among the group).

Scripture Reading

If there is nothing provided by the church, here an appropriate passage of Scripture may be read.

Sermon

If there is nothing provided by the church, here some group discussion may take place concerning the passage of Scripture previously read. Some good Bible study guides may be acquired through Matthias Media (<u>www.matthiasmedia.com.au</u>).

The Creed

Choose a Creed to say together

Apostles' Creed

I believe in God the Father Almighty maker of heaven and earth: And in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from there he shall judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit; the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Nicene Creed

We believe in one God the Father, the Almighty maker of heaven and earth of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord. Jesus Christ the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Collect

Choose a suitable Collect to pray (e.g., Seasonal, or Circumstantial, or Other Collects).

Intercessions

If there is nothing provided by the church, here some intercessions may be prayed. A good structure consists in prayers for the world (rulers, society, the sick and suffering), the church (ministers, and local needs), and ourselves (family and personal needs). Perhaps the group may share prayer points and pray particularly for one another.

At this present time of crisis, the following or similar prayer would be suitable:

We ask you, faithful Father, through Your Son our Savior, for our Prime Minister (Scott Morrison) and his Government, for our Premier (Gladys Berejiklian), and for all who hold office in this land. Give them wisdom and wise counsel, that they may lead our communities to respond to the present coronavirus crisis with calm and generosity. For those presently suffering with this sickness: grant them the victory of trust and hope, in the bloody cross and the empty tomb of Christ, that they may never lose their faith in your loving purposes. For all who are working to discover the causes and cures of this disease, grant them your wisdom, and the realisation that in you all things are possible. We ask this in the name of him who went about doing good and healing all manner of disease; your Son, Christ Jesus our Lord. **Amen.**

Conclude your prayers with the Lord's Prayer

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your Name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen.

Mutual Edification

Here the group may choose to offer words of edification to one another. Words of encouragement could be shared between members. Words of exhortation related to the Scripture or Sermon could be said. Words of personal testimony could be shared. Various other kinds of Gospel speech could be used here to build each other up in Christ Jesus.

Prayer for God's Blessing

Use one of the below, or any other suitable passage of Scripture to conclude

May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with us all, today and evermore. Amen.

May the Lord bless us, and keep us. May the Lord make his face shine upon us, and be gracious to us. May the Lord turn his face towards us, and give us peace. Amen.

Household Worship – Second Order

Following the broad outline of Morning and Evening Prayer, this pattern of service provides a number of set alternatives from Common Prayer (2012) for each major segment: Approaching God together, Hearing God's Word, Responding to his Word, and Going out to serve.

The gathering may begin with praise and thanksgiving or with penitence. When the reading and exposition of Scripture call for repentance or renewed commitment, it may be better to delay the confession of sin and assurance of God's forgiveness until after the ministry of the Word.

Approaching God together

A psalm of praise and thanksgiving could be read together, followed by spontaneous prayers and praises.

One or more of these sentences of Scripture could be read to encourage personal reflection before saying a prayer for forgiveness and repentance together.

Seek the Lord while he may be found; call on him while he is near. Let the wicked forsake their ways and the unrighteous their thoughts. Let them turn to the Lord and he will have mercy on them, and to our God, for he will freely pardon. *Isaiah 55:6-7*

The Lord our God is merciful and forgiving, even though we have rebelled against him; we have not obeyed the Lord our God or kept the laws he gave us. *Daniel 9:9-10*

Since we have a great high priest, who has ascended into heaven, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to feel sympathy for our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are-yet he did not sin. Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. *Hebrews 4:14-16*

Merciful God,

we humbly admit that we need your help. We confess that we have wandered from your way: we have done wrong, and we have failed to do what is right. You alone can save us. Have mercy on us: wipe out our sins and teach us to forgive others. Bring forth in us the fruit of the Spirit that we may live as disciples of Christ. This we ask in the name of Jesus our Saviour. Amen. Heavenly Father, we praise you for adopting us as your children and making us heirs of eternal life. In your mercy you have washed us from our sins and made us clean in your sight. Yet we still fail to love you and serve you as we should. Forgive us our sins and renew us by your grace, that we may continue to grow as members of Christ, in whom alone is our salvation. Amen.

Heavenly Father, you have loved us with an everlasting love, but we have often gone our own way, and rejected your will for our lives. We are sorry for our sins and turn away from them. For the sake of your Son who died for us, forgive us, cleanse us, and change us. By your Holy Spirit, enable us to live for you, and to please you in every way, for the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

One of the following assurances of God's forgiveness could be read out.

God desires that no one should perish, but that all should turn to Christ and live. We confess our sins in response to his call. God pardons those who humbly repent and truly believe the gospel. Therefore, we have peace with God, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

or

As high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is God's love towards those who fear him; as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us, in Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

or

If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. *1 John 1:8-9*

Hearing God's Word

One of these prayers may be said by the leader to prepare those present to listen to the Bible readings and an exposition of God's Word (either by someone in the group or in some online fashion).

Thank you, Father, for making yourself known to us and showing us the way of salvation through faith in your Son. Teach us through your word and equip us for every good work, for the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

or

Thank you, Father, that all Scripture is God-breathed, and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness. Open our hearts to receive your word, that we may know you better and be thoroughly equipped for every good work, through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

or

Gracious God, your word is alive and active, sharper than any double-edged sword. Today, when we hear your voice, deliver us from hardness of heart. Help us to put away everything that keeps us from persevering in your way, for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

Responding to God's Word

A time of questions, discussion, and reflection on the Bible readings and exposition of God's Word could follow here.

A confession of sin and an assurance of God's forgiveness could occur here, or the Apostles' Creed could be said together or read by one person on behalf of the group.

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to hell. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father; from there he will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Various collects could be said here, together with informal thanksgivings and prayers for the world, the local community, the church, the spread of the gospel, the sick, and the needy. The Lord's Prayer could conclude this time of prayer:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

Going out to serve

One or other of these prayers of dedication could be used:

Lord Jesus Christ, fill us with your Spirit and send us out with confidence in your word, to tell the world of your saving acts, and bring glory to your name. Amen.

or

Heavenly Father, take us and use us to love and serve you and all people, in the power of your Spirit and in the name of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. Gracious God, you made an eternal covenant with us through the blood of your Son, and brought him back from the dead as the great Shepherd of your sheep. Equip us with everything good for doing your will. Work in us what is pleasing to you, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Household Worship with Children

The following outline for Household Worship with Children requires some preparation in advance. Firstly, you will need to know what your church is providing in terms of children's ministry material. Secondly, you need to consider how to adapt the structure below to work well in your household. If this idea is new for your children, start with a shorter 'service', and slowly expand outwards. Remember, even something regular is better than nothing.

Come to God!

Share about God's love for children and how he loves their praise, before praying a short prayer to begin, e.g.,

Dear God, thank you that you have the whole world in your hands and you care for each one of us here today. Please grow us to be more like the Lord Jesus. Amen.

or

Choose a suitable Bible passage to read at the start of your time of family worship.

Sing!

Find one or two good songs to sing (e.g., Colin Buchanan, or Classic Children's Songs, or Christian Hymns) and sing them – perhaps with pre-decided actions, or even asking the children to make up actions.

Ask!

Find an appropriate and good quality catechism (e.g., <u>Colin Buchanan's 'Catechismo'</u>, My First Catechism, New City Catechism, Heidelberg Catechism, etc.) and select a Question and Answer for today. If appropriate make up actions to accompany the question, and the answer. Sometimes it might be fun to make a game of learning the Answer – a quick snack works well as a reward!

Listen!

If your church has provided material for Children's Ministry, then only use the following where it may be helpful.

Ask the children to sit, and to prepare themselves to hear God speak to us in the Bible. A short prayer before this is worth doing regularly, e.g. 1 Sam. 3:10:

Speak Lord, your servant is listening.

Choose an appropriate Children's Bible and continue each week to teach through it.

Pray!

Ask the children if there are any things which could be prayed for our country, our church, or our homes. It may be an appropriate time to say sorry to our God who forgives us because of Jesus.

If the children are able, they may like to pray these prayers. Also, depending on the Season (e.g., Easter), it may be good to pray using one of the Collects, suitably modified for children.

Do!

As above, if your church has provided material for Children's Ministry, then only use the following where it may be helpful.

Depending on the passage read out in the Children's Bible, can you prepare a short activity (drama, game, puzzle, outdoor adventure, etc.) to actively reinforce the lesson from God's Word?

Refresh (and Chat, and Laugh)!

Have a break for a piece of fruit and some water. But before the break, ask one or more children to pray (e.g., to give thanks for something to do with the Bible passage, and to give thanks for the food).

Finish!

Finish up the time with a song, a prayer, or even a catechism challenge!

Morning Prayers for Every Day

This order of prayer may be used individually or in small groups of worshippers. In a group setting, consider creative ways to move through this order of service (e.g., a leader may say the unbold text and the whole group say the bold text, children could say certain parts and adults other parts, etc.).

We are here before our Creator and Father, to bring our thanksgiving, to listen to His Holy Word, and to offer our prayers. Let us prepare ourselves by confessing our sins.

Confession:

Seek the Lord while he may be found, **Call upon Him while he is near.** Turn back to the Lord, who will have mercy on us; **To our God who will freely pardon us.**

Silence for confession

Have mercy on us, O God, according to your loving-kindness; And in your great compassion forgive us all our offences; For we have sinned against you, And done what is evil in your sight. Purge us from our sin and we shall be pure: Wash us, and we shall be whiter than snow. Create in us a clean heart, O God: And make us true in our innermost being.

God forgives the sins of all who truly repent. As far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our sins from us in Jesus Christ our Saviour. **Amen.**

Blessed is the Lord, For he has heard our prayer; Therefore our hearts dance for joy And with our mouths we shall thank the Lord.

Thanksgiving:

VenitePsalm 95:1-7Come, let us sing to the Lord;Let us shout for joy to the Rock of our Salvation.Let us come before his presence with thanksgivingAnd raise a loud shout to him with psalms.For the Lord is a great God, And a great King above all gods.In his hand are the caverns of the earth,And the heights of the hills are his also.The sea is his, for he made it,And his hands have molded the dry land.

Come, let us bow down, and bend the knee, And kneel before the Lord our Maker. For he is our God, And we are the people of his pasture and the sheep of his hand.

JubilatePsalm 100Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth.Serve the Lord with gladness;Come before Him with joyful songs.Know that the Lord is God.It is he who made us, and we are his;We are his people, the sheep of his pasture.

Silence for Thanksgiving

A Litany of Thanksgiving

Leader says Let us give thanks to God our Father for all his gifts so freely given to us: For the beauty and wonder of your creation in earth and sky and sea, *We thank you, Lord.*

For our daily food and drink, our homes and families, *We thank you, Lord.*

For minds to think, and hearts to love, and hands to serve, *We thank you, Lord.*

For health and strength to work, and free time to rest and play, *We thank you, Lord.*

For the brave and courageous, who are patient in suffering and faithful in adversity *We thank you, Lord.*

For all who truly seek after truth, liberty, and justice, *We thank you, Lord.*

For the communion of saints, in all times and places *We thank you, Lord.*

Above all, we give you thanks for everything which we have in Christ Jesus our Lord; *To him be praise and glory, with you, O Father, and the Holy Spirit, now and for ever. Amen.*

The Psalm¹

The Reading of Holy Scripture

Leader says Prayer for illumination

Bible reading - reader go slow!

The Collects (use the weekly seasonal collect, or circumstantial collect as appropriate)

Monday

O Lord, our God, we bend the knee to your Majesty. Together with all of your people we offer you our lives on this new day, give us your grace to love and serve you to the praise of Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Tuesday

Almighty and everlasting God, we thank you that you have brought us safely to the beginning of this day. Keep us from falling into sin or running into danger, order us in all we do, and guide us to those things which please you; Through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Wednesday

Maker of all, you have created the heavens and the earth and made us in your own image: may we be glad for all your works and serve you with reverence and thanksgiving; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Thursday

O God, the author of peace and lover of concord, to know you is eternal life, to serve you is perfect freedom. Defend us your servants from all assaults of the enemy; that we, surely trusting in your defence, may not fear any power that opposes you; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Friday

Almighty Father, whose most dear Son received joy only after he first suffered pain, and entered into glory only after he was first crucified: Mercifully grant that we, walking in the way of the cross, may find it none other than the way of life and peace; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Saturday

Almighty and eternal God, so draw our hearts to you, so guide our minds, so fill our imaginations, so control our will, that we may be wholly yours, totally dedicated unto you; and then use us as you want, to your glory, and the wellbeing of your people; through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

Time for open intercessions

The Lord's Prayer

Prayers for the Home

A Short Prayer to be said in the Morning

Lord, our heavenly Father, almighty and everlasting God, we thank you for bringing us safely to this day. Keep us by your mighty power, and grant that we fall into no sin, neither run into any kind of danger; but lead and govern us in all things, that we may always do what is righteous in your sight, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

A Prayer to be said in the Morning

O Merciful Lord God, heavenly father, I render most high glory, praise, and thanks to you, that you have preserved me both this night, and all the time and days of my life hitherto, under your protection: and that I have been sustained in life until this present hour. And I ask you from the heart, that you would receive me this day, and for the rest of my whole life from henceforth, into the ruling and governing of your Holy Spirit: that all manner of darkness of unbelief, infidelity, and of fleshly lusts and affections, may be utterly chased and drive out of my heart: and that I may be justified and saved both body and soul through right and living faith: and so walk in the light of your most godly truth, to your glory and praise, and to the profit and furtherance of my neighbours, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

A Prayer for Husbands and Wives to be said in the Morning

Our heavenly Father, who knows us better than we know ourselves: Search us, O God, and know our hearts; test us and know our anxious thoughts. Glorious Jesus Christ, who for us and our salvation died and rose again: Rule us, O God, that your beauty and that of your bride might be seen through us today. O Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life, who works in us both rebirth and renewal: Breathe on us, O God, and incline our hearts to keep the law of Christ,

in whose name we pray, Amen.

A General Prayer of Confession for the Morning

Almighty and most merciful father, we have erred and strayed from your ways, like lost sheep. We have followed too much the devices, and desires, of our own hearts. We have offended, against your holy laws. We have left undone those things which we ought to have down: we have done those things which we ought not to have done: and there is no health in us: but you, O Lord, have mercy upon us, miserable offenders. Spare us, O God, who confess our faults. Restore us who are penitent, according to your promises, declared to mankind, in Christ Jesus our Lord. And grant, O most merciful father, for his sake, that we may here live a godly, righteous, and sober life, to the glory of your holy Name. Amen

A Short Prayer while Making Coffee or Tea

Our heavenly Father, the Maker of Heaven and Earth; I receive with gratitude this gift of your creation, and ask that you would mercifully use it to strengthen my faith and grow my knowledge of the truth today, in the name of Christ, Amen.

A General Prayer for Thanksgiving

Gracious God, we humbly thank you for all your gifts so freely given to us, for life and health and safety, for power to work, leisure to rest, and for all that is beautiful in creation and human life. But, above all, we praise you for our Saviour Jesus Christ, for his death and resurrection, for the gift of your Spirit, and for the hope of sharing in your glory. Fill our hearts with all joy and peace in believing; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

A Prayer to be said at the Breakfast Table

O God, whose mercies are new every morning, we thank you for showering us already with your provision of life, health, shelter, and purpose. Would you bless this meal, such that it would sustain us today; and would you bless us, such that we would serve others today, to your glory, and the well being of your people. Amen.

A Prayer to be said at the Lunch Table

Almighty God, the mighty creator of all things, and provider of our every need; even as we hunger for the meal you have given us now, would you also deepen our hunger for your Word, that today, we may continue to love you and our neighbour, in Jesus' name. Amen.

A Prayer for Leisure Time

Our father, by whose creativity and wisdom, made this entire universe, and who made us in your image to enjoy the beauty of this world and recreation within its bounds. We praise you for health, and strength, and leisure, and we ask that all our play and fun would be done to your praise and delight, in the name of Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen.

A Prayer for Rest Time

Sixth Sunday in Lent

Almighty and everlasting God, in tender love towards mankind you sent your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ, to take our nature upon him and to suffer death on the cross, that all mankind should follow the example of his great humility: grant that we may follow the example of his suffering, and also be made partakers of his resurrection; through him who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, now and for ever. **Amen**.

Good Friday

Eternal God, who gives everything good: give us the peace our world cannot give, so that we can obediently live for you, through Jesus Christ our Saviour. Amen.

Collects for aid against all perils

Lighten our darkness, Lord, we pray: and in your great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of this night; for the love of your only Son our Saviour Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

Be present, merciful God, and protect us through the hours of this night: that we, who are tired through the changes and chances of this passing world, may rest on your eternal changelessness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

A Collect for all conditions of people

Our God, creator and preserver of all mankind: we pray for all people, that you would make your way known to them, your saving power among all the nations of the world.

Especially we pray for the welfare of your whole church, that it may be guided by your Holy Spirit, so that all who call themselves Christians may be led in truth and be spiritually united, in the bond of peace, and in righteousness of life.

We commend to your fatherly goodness all who are sick or sad [especially those N, and N, ...], that you might comfort and relieve them, giving them patience in their sufferings, and a good outcome through all their afflictions. All this we ask for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Collects from the Holy Communion Service*

Almighty God, who knows our hearts, our desires, and all our secrets: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by your Holy Spirit, that we might perfectly love you, and magnify your holy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

Help us our Lord, as we pray together, and guide us towards our everlasting salvation; that, among all the changes and chances of this life, we may be always defended by your great and ready help; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

Almighty Lord and everlasting God; would you guide and govern, both our hearts and bodies, in the ways of your laws and commandments; that through your powerful protection, both here and ever, we may be preserved in body and soul; through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. **Amen**.

Almighty God, we ask that the words, which we have heard this day with our outward ears, may through your grace be so grafted inwardly in our hearts, that they may bring forth in us the fruit of good living, to the honour and praise of your Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

Our Lord, go before us and give us grace and help in all our doings, that in all our works, started, continued, and ended in you, we may glorify your holy Name, and finally by your mercy receive everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

Almighty God, the fountain of all wisdom, who knows what we need before we ask: we ask you to have compassion upon our weaknesses; and for those things that we do not know about or pray about, grant us these things, for the worthiness of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

Almighty God, who has promised to hear the prayers of those who ask in your Son's Name: We ask you to incline your ears to us that have just made our prayers and to you; and we ask that those things, which we have faithfully asked according to your will, may be given to us, to help us with our needs, to the set forth your glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.
